To have a whole-house assessment, you must first submit a non-refundable assessment fee of \$25. Once you submit your Whole House Assessment Request Form, signed waiver, and \$25 assessment fee, we will contact you to schedule your assessment visit. You will receive a full report with recommendations for all feasible stormwater tools.

After receiving the assessment report, you can choose which stormwater tool you would like to have installed. Then we will connect you with a preapproved contractor to schedule an installation or consultation.
